



POSTER PLAYGROUND

Showcase your passion for planning at SOUL 2018's *Poster Playground!* Prepare a poster on a planning or design topic of your choice that communicates a connection to the theme of SOUL and its streams of PLACE, STORY, and ROLE. Posters may featuring academic or professional work, or students may forge a connection with a planning professional to collaborate on a poster showcasing existing work or a directed study.

The posters will be displayed for the duration of the conference for delegates to peruse at their leisure. Poster-makers will have the opportunity to present their work at the Poster Playground event. The presentation format is intended to be informal, providing students with the opportunity to discuss their passion for planning and to network with other students and planning professionals.

The Committee is seeking innovative and meaningful work that presents a wide array of SOULful projects from across the country. Submissions will be reviewed and selected based on the following criteria:

- Project connection to SOUL and its streams of PLACE, STORY, and ROLE;
- Clarity of concept and creativity;
- Adherence to the minimum information and format requirements of the Call for Posters (discussed below).

What to include in your proposal:

- Title of Poster which clearly indicates the topic.
- Name(s) of presenter(s), affiliated University and program, and affiliated collaborator (if applicable).
- Clear and concise description or abstract of the poster (200 word maximum) for the selection process.

Please provide the above information by filling out the [Poster Playground Submission Form](#) by April 2nd, 2018. If selected, you will receive follow-up communications with further details about requirements and logistics for your poster. Poster proposals from Academics and Professionals will be accepted, but priority will be given to student submissions. [Here are a couple project posters examples](#) created by University of Manitoba City Planning students to provide you with possible guidelines for your proposal and poster.

The University of Manitoba Association of Planning Students (UMAPS) has offered to provide at-cost printing services and poster set up services in advance of the conference. The exact cost of printing will be communicated upon proposal selection, but prospective poster-makers and/or their collaborators should be prepared to pay up to \$65.00 to cover printing costs should they choose to use these services.
