A Snapshot of Grey County

- Grey County has roughly 96,000 permanent residents, located approximately 2 hours northwest of Toronto.
- Four season recreational activities increases our population with seasonal residents and tourists.
- Grey County is made up of 9 municipalities, with towns, villages, and small cities, but is primarily made up of agricultural, recreational, and natural lands.
- Grey County includes large swaths of the Niagara Escarpment, Bruce Trail, Georgian Bay shoreline, and also includes Blue Mountain Resorts.
- Our Planning department includes
 4 5 planners.



What is Recolour Grey?

- Beginning in May 2016, Grey County began drafting a new County Official Plan, branded 'Recolour Grey'.
- From the outset staff and council were determined to do as much public consultation as possible, with an emphasis on hearing new voices, and reaching out to those under-represented in traditional planning processes.
- Going out to the community, rather than making them come to us, was a key principle of Recolour Grey.
- One of the first steps was a youth design competition to design the Recolour Grey branding.
- Throughout the entire process the public were consulted, consulted again, and re-consulted.







Recolour Grey – by the Numbers

Between 2016 – 2018, public and stakeholder engagement included;


- 18 youth sessions at libraries, classrooms, or youth centres,
- 13 public events attended (e.g. fairs, downtown street sales, farmers markets, etc.) with the Recolour Grey planning booth,
- 9 municipal public workshops,
- 8 speaking engagements at stakeholder group meetings,
- 5 discussion papers and 1 What We've Heard Comment Summary,
- 4 drop in public open houses,
- 3 meetings with municipal planning staff and/or municipal CAO/Clerks,
- 3 contests (logo, colouring, and photo),
- 3 Official Plan drafts,
- 2 County Council workshops,
- · 2 public meetings with County Council,
- 2 provincial meetings, and

countless phone calls, emails, social media posts, and individual meetings.



What did the Youth Tell Us?

There were many common themes from youth across the County, including;

- · Youth need to be appreciated and not stereotyped or vilified,
- More outdoor (skateparks, splashpads, or dog parks) and indoor (arcades, arenas, trampoline parks) recreational facilities are needed,
- Youth need safe spaces to hangout and meet each other,
- Parks, trails, wildlife, and natural spaces are important reasons why they love their communities,
- Additional job opportunities are needed for youth retention,
- Youth-friendly transportation methods are needed,

- Need for more shopping / restaurants in the County, and
- Youth want to be involved in our communities and are seeking ways to do so.







How did you get Youth Input?

- Youth generally don't come to public meetings, unless dragged by their parents. Instead we tried to go out to the youth at;
 - youth centres,
 - community events,
 - classrooms / libraries,
 - live-in rehab facilities, and
 - youth festivals / conferences.
- We used LEGO[®] to have kids 'plan' or 're-plan' spaces in their towns.
- We also had colouring contests and 'draw your ideal community' opportunities.
- Social media did not prove effective in gaining youth input, though it was useful for other demographics.

What did You Do with the Input?

- Many comments received were incorporated into the new Recolour Grey Official Plan, which was adopted October 25, 2018, including sections on communities, parkland, natural areas, climate change, etc.
- Some comments were outside of the purview of County Planning Staff, in most cases these comments were shared with;
 - other County departments,
 - municipalities,
 - the Health Unit,
 - agencies,
 - youth centres, or

- social service groups with responsibility for those fields.
- In some cases comments were not able to be directly addressed i.e. we need an Old Navy or a Dairy Queen.
- This consultation has given us greater insight into youth values and opinions across our County.
