- Provides a single point of service delivery to the Parliamentary Partners and the Office of the Prime Minister and Privy Council, and commercial tenants in the Precinct.



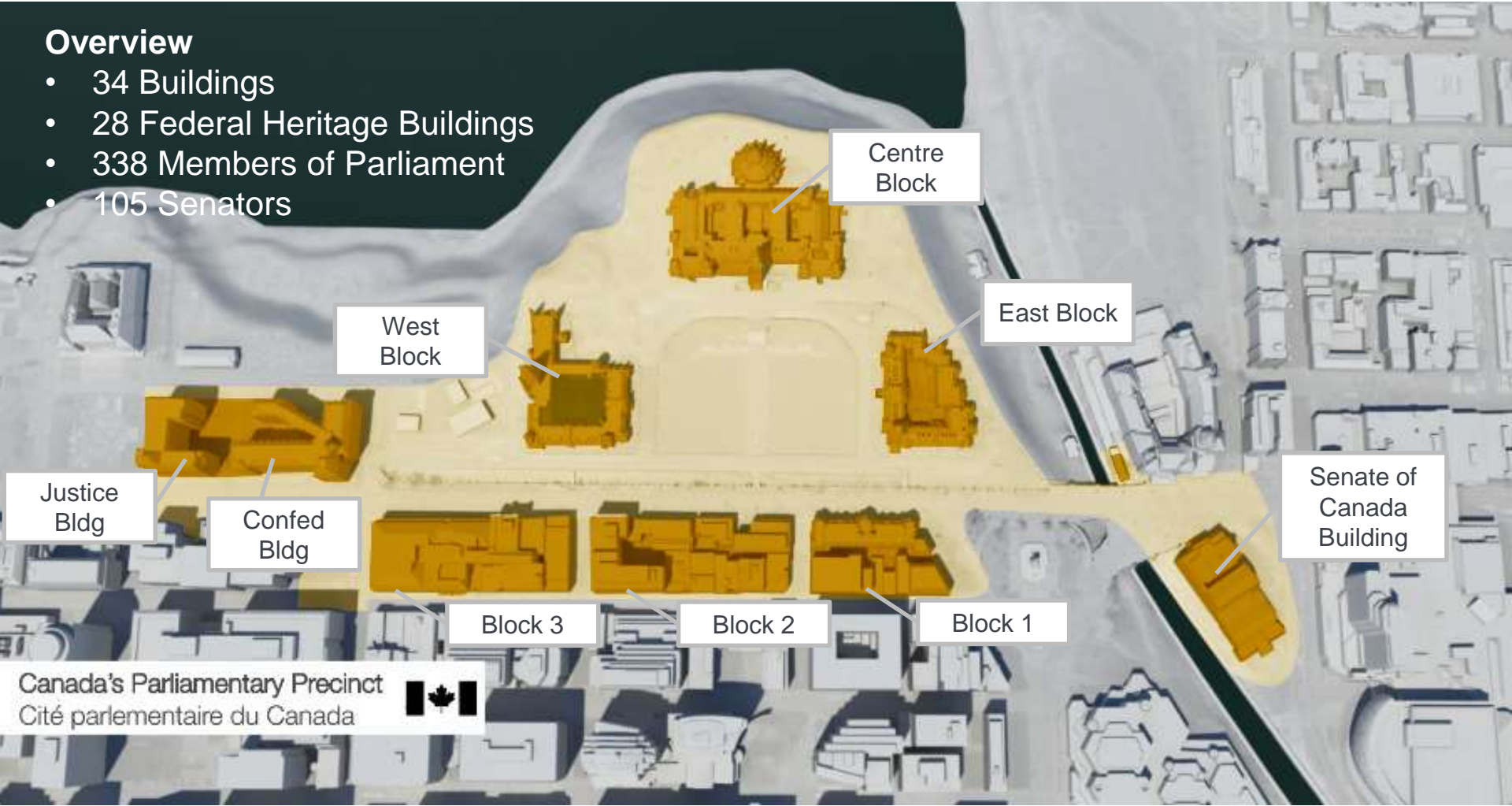

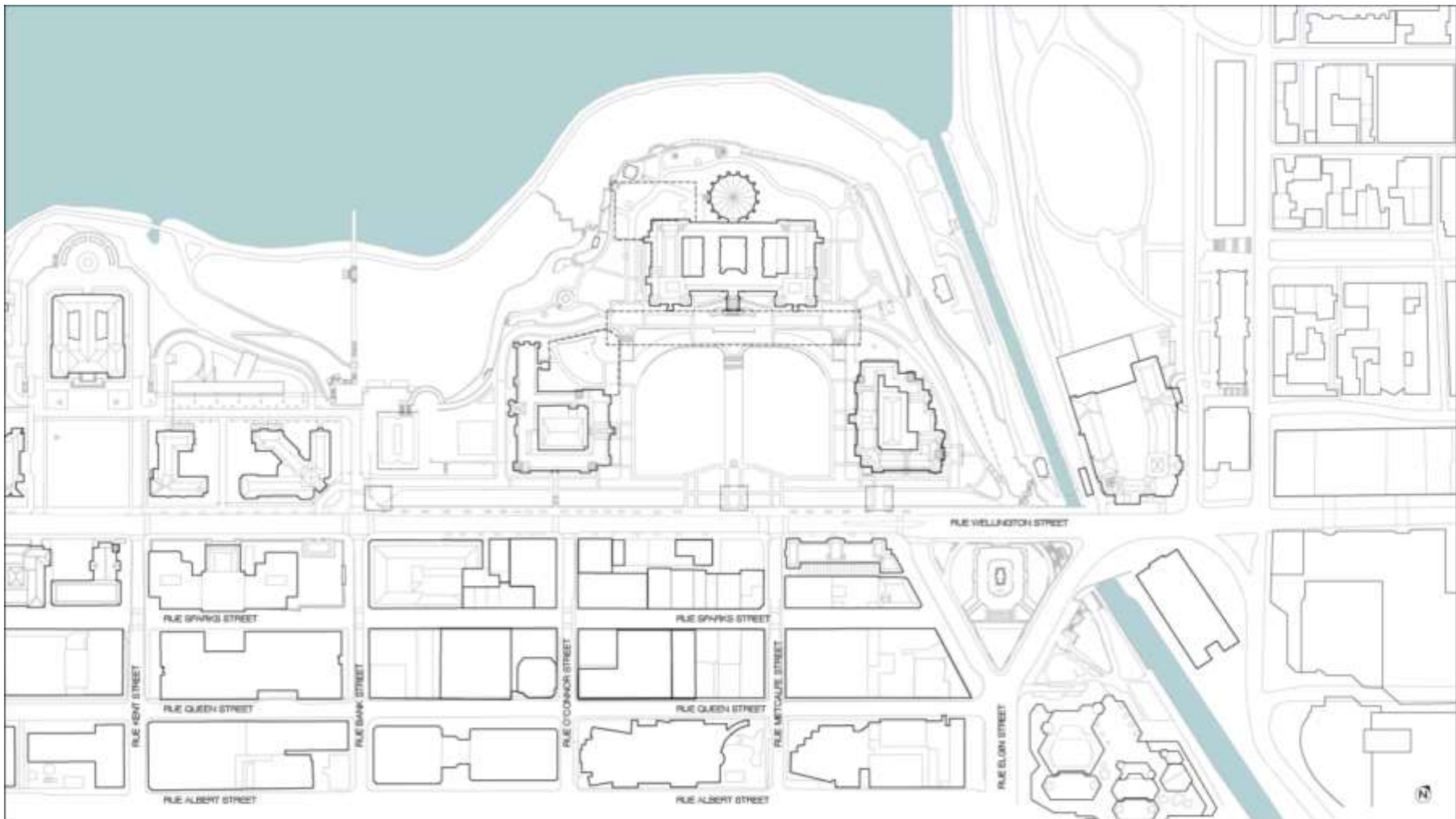

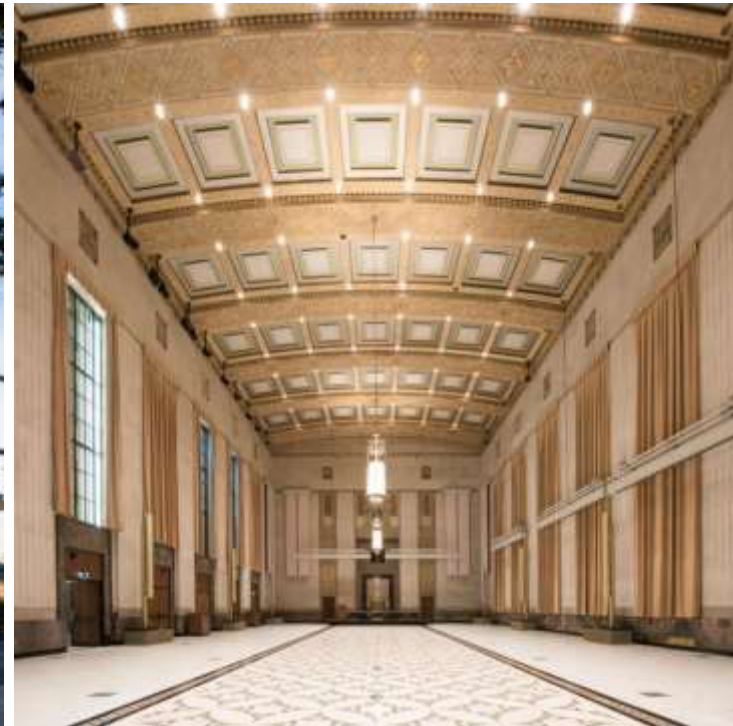

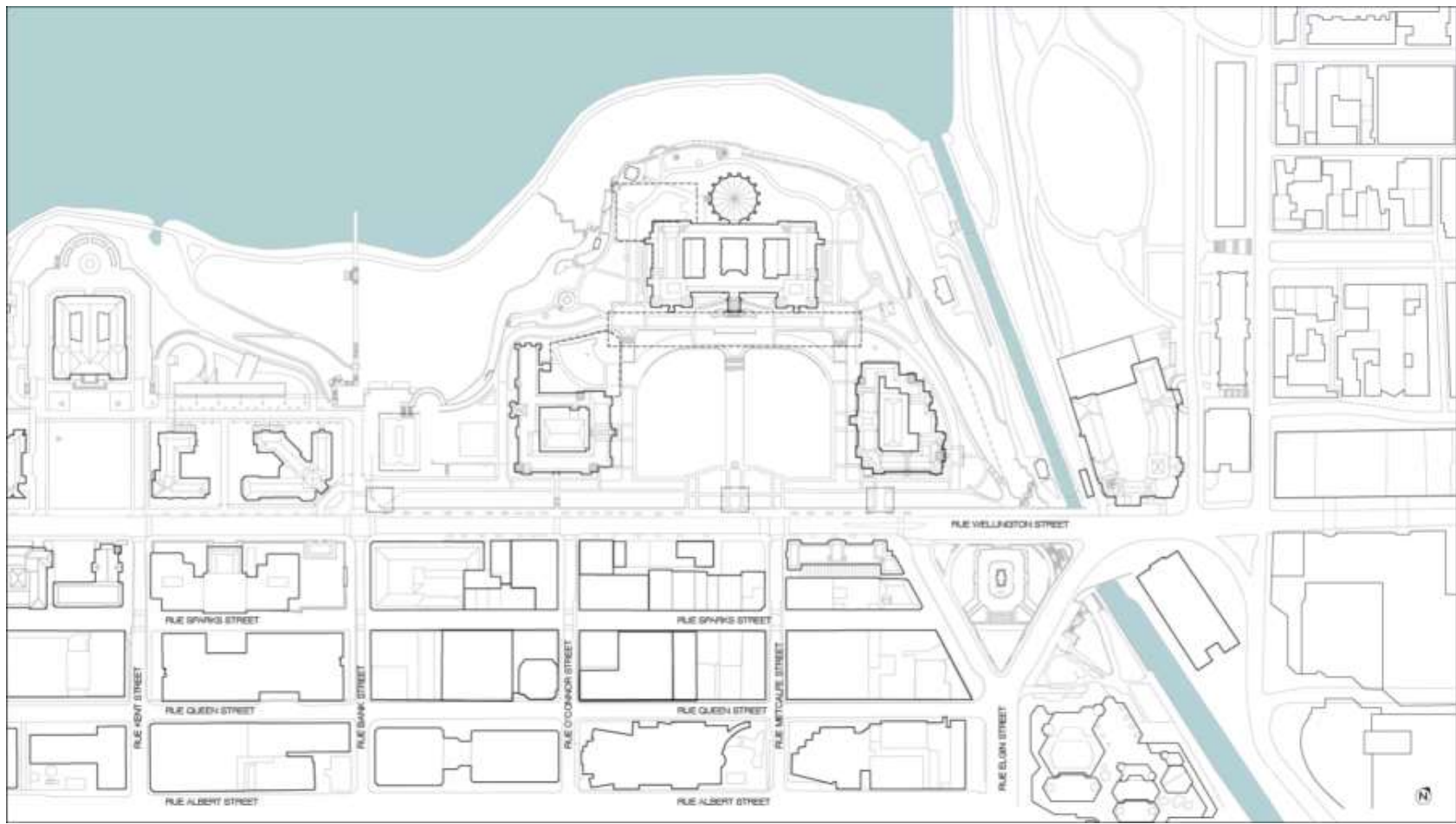
