Why are we talking about Mobility Hubs?



» As transportation options evolve, how people access the multitude of trip options expands. Mobility hubs serve as key locations for mode choice.

» Through the introduction of mobility hubs, engineers and planners have an opportunity to enhance the equality of access to new transportation modes and design resilience of the built environment for all users.



The design objectives for an effective Mobility Hub:

A Mobility Hub needs to:

- » Increase the number of transportation options available to the community
- » Encourage environmentally and financially sustainable access and mobility
- » Prioritize people through design
- » Establish an ease of transfer between modes
- » Be flexible and scaled to the surrounding environment



It needs to provide transportation options




It needs to make accessing those options easy

- The design needs to be seamless for accessing all other modes.
 Consider access—egress conflict points and user comfort.
- » This includes Mobility as a Service or a single point of use




It needs to be at the right scale

- The scale is set both by the potential number of users and the market fundamentals.
- » A mobility hub needs to serve users on likely trips and introduce new options that have market potential.
